The Commission's delegate makes a fresh determination allocating 1,980 seats per week in each direction on the Indonesia route for five years.

1 The application for renewal

- 1.1 On 8 October 2008 the Commission issued in favour of Pacific Blue Australia Determination [2008] IASC 120 (the Determination) allocating 1,980 seats per week in each direction on the Indonesia route in accordance with the terms of the Australia Indonesia air services arrangements. The Determination was subsequently varied by:
 - Decision [2010] IASC 206 transferring the capacity from Pacific Blue Australia to Virgin Blue Airlines;
 - Decision [2011] IASC 214 permitting Virgin Blue Airlines to provide services jointly with V Australia;
 - Resolution [2011] IASC R18 recognising the name change of Virgin Blue Airlines
 Pty Ltd to Virgin Australia Airlines Pty Ltd and Virgin Blue International Airlines,
 (trading as V Australia) to Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd; and
 - Decision [2012] IASC 204 transferring capacity from Virgin Australia Airlines Pty Ltd to Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd.
- 1.2 Under the *International Air Services Commission Act 1992* (the Act), the Commission must start its consideration of the renewal of a determination at least 12 months before the expiry of the Determination. The Determination expires on 7 October 2013. In view of this, the Commission sent, on 12 August 2012, a letter to Virgin Australia inviting it to apply for renewal if it wished to renew the Determination.
- 1.3 On 3 September 2012, Virgin Australia applied to the Commission for the renewal of the Determination.
- 1.4 As required by sections 12 and 17 of the Act, the Commission published a notice on 4 September 2012 inviting other applications for the capacity subject to renewal. No applications were received.

2 Delegate's assessment

- 2.1 In accordance with section 27AB of the Act and regulation 3A of the *International Air Services Commission Regulations 1992*, the delegate of the Commission may consider the Virgin Australia application. (For purposes of this determination, all references to the Commission include the delegate of the Commission).
- 2.2 In considering an application for renewal of a determination under section 8 of the Act, the Commission must make the same allocation of capacity as the original determination unless the Commission is satisfied that the allocation is no longer of benefit to the public. In assessing the benefit to the public of an allocation of capacity, the Commission must apply the criteria set out for that purpose in the policy statement made by the Minister under section 11 of the Act.
- 2.3 Under paragraph 6.2 of the Minister's Policy Statement (No. 5) of 19 May 2004 (the Policy Statement), in circumstances where there is only one applicant for allocation of capacity on a route, only the criteria in paragraph 4 are applicable. Paragraph 4 provides that the use of entitlements by Australian carriers under a bilateral arrangement is of benefit to the public unless such carriers are not reasonably capable of obtaining the necessary approvals to operate on the route and are not reasonably capable of implementing their applications.
- 2.4 The Commission notes that:
 - there are no other applicants seeking capacity on the route; and
 - Virgin Australia is an established international carrier and is therefore reasonably capable of obtaining the necessary approvals to operate on the route and of implementing its application.
- 2.5 Under paragraph 8.1 of the Policy Statement, there is a presumption in favour of the carrier seeking the renewal.
- 2.6 In these circumstances, the Commission is satisfied that renewal of Determination [2008] IASC 120 would be of benefit to the public.
- 2.7 Virgin Australia has advised the Commission that from mid-January 2013 all Virgin Australia flights will be operated under the VA designator and that once this occurs code share operations between Virgin Australia entities will no longer be required. Accordingly, in this determination the Commission has removed conditions contained in Determination [2008] IASC 120, as varied by Decision [2011] IASC 214, allowing for code sharing between Virgin Australia entities.

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- Determination for renewal of Determination [2008] IASC 120 allocating capacity on the Indonesia route to Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd ([2013] IASC 116)
- 3.1 The Commission makes a determination in favour of Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd, allocating 1,980 seats per week in each direction on the Indonesia route under the Australia Indonesia air services arrangements.
- 3.2 The determination is for five years from 8 October 2013.
- 3.3 The determination is subject to the following conditions:
 - Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd is required to fully utilise the capacity;
 - only Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd is permitted to utilise the capacity;
 - Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd is not permitted to utilise the capacity to provide services jointly with another Australian carrier or any other person without the approval of the Commission; and
 - changes in relation to the ownership and control of Virgin Australia
 International Airlines Pty Ltd are permitted except to the extent that any change:
 - results in the designation of the airline as an Australian carrier under the Australia – Indonesia air services arrangements being withdrawn; or
 - has the effect that another Australian carrier, or a person (or group of persons) having substantial ownership or effective control of another Australian carrier, would take substantial ownership of Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd or be in a position to exercise effective control of Virgin Australia International Airlines Pty Ltd, without the prior consent of the Commission.
